18TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Ex16:2-4,12-15 PS 78:3-4,23-24 25,54 Eph 4:17,20-24 Jn 6:24-35

A recurring theme in Exodus is the grumbling or murmuring of the people against Moses and the Lord. In today's text they accuse Moses and Aaron of having brought them out of Egypt "into this desert to make the whole community die of famine!" (v3). In response the Lord sends them quail and manna, "bread from heaven," not only to provide for them but also to test them, "to see whether they follow my instructions"(v4). These gifts from heaven serve to prove to the Israelites "that I, the Lord, am your God" (v12). They have just departed Egypt, a land with hundreds of gods, but it is the Lord who cares for them and who invites them into an exclusive relationship.

Today's Gospel continues the story of the loaves and the fish as the disciples follow Jesus to Capernaum, "across the sea" (v25) from where they were fed. He challenges their motive for following him, claiming that they are seeking him "because you ate the loaves and were filled" (v26). More important than the food he gave them, which is "food that perishes," is "the food that endures for eternal life" (v27). They compare the food he gave them to the manna their ancestors ate in the desert. But Jesus tells that it is not Moses but "my Father [who] gives you the true bread from heaven" (v33). Their response is to ask him to "give us this bread always" (V34).

The author of Ephesians encourages his audience to "no longer live as the Gentiles do"(v17). Embracing the Christian faith, they are called to "put away the old self" (v22) and "put on the new self, created in God's way in righteousness and holiness of truth"(v24).

For Reflection: Do I sometimes forget the ways God has blessed me in the past? Do I pray for a deeper hunger for the bread of heaven?

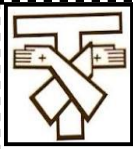

St. Maximilian Mary Kolbe


Ordained a priest at a young age, Maximilian Kolbe was determined to combat religious indifference in his native Poland (now Ukraine) and published a successful magazine to preach the Gospel. When the Nazis invaded in 1939, they noticed Fr. Kolbe and he was eventually imprisoned at Auschwitz. One day, ten men were chosen to die as punishment for a prisoner escape. Fr. Kolbe offered himself instead of a family man. The man saved, Francis Gajowniczek, was present at Fr. Kolbe's canonization.

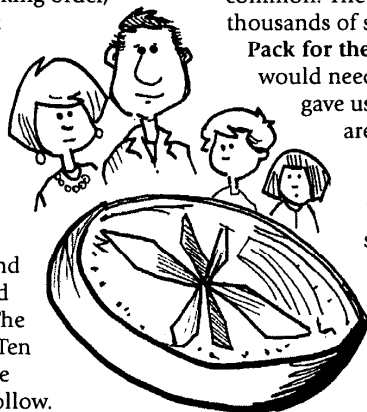

Catechism of the Catholic Church. It is a summary of what Catholics throughout the world believe in common. The Church also offers us thousands of saints as models.

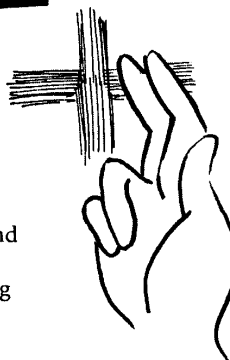
