## 20TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

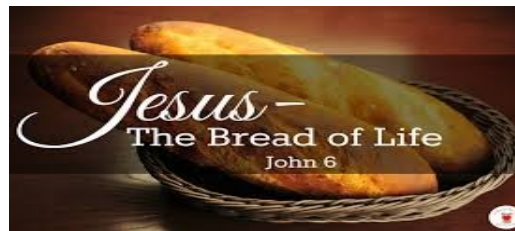
Prv 9:1-6, Ps 34:2-3, 4-5,6-7 Eph 5:15-20 Jn 6:51-58

Wisdom is personified in the Old Testament world as a woman. Alongside Folly, also depicted as a woman, Wisdom invites people to join her in the banquet. She extends her invitation to join her in her house, one with “seven columns”(v1), an image implying greatness. Her invitation is extended to “whoever is simple...[or] lack of understanding” (v4), that they might learn from her and benefit. To dwell in her house is to “advance in the way of understanding” (v6). And so hers is an invitation worth considering. To choose Wisdom over Folly is to choose the way of God and the way of life.

In John’s Gospel today we continue to hear Jesus’s Bread of Life discourse. Jesus declares himself to be “the living bread that came down from heaven,” which is my “my flesh for the life of the world” (v51). Whereas the manna in the wilderness was only for the Israelites, Jesus’s gifts will nourish the whole world. But the crowd does not understand Jesus and asks, “How can this man give us his flesh to eat?”(v52). But John’s audience knows that this bread is a reference to the Eucharist, which is a sharing in the body and blood of Christ. As Jesus has “life because of the Father,” whoever “feeds on me will have life because of me” (v57). Our union with Christ unites us to the Father.

The letter to the Ephesians continues to call us to live lives worthy of our baptism— “not as foolish persons but as wise”(v15). Our author warns us, “the days of evil” (v16), so we must strive to live as God calls us to live, “ filled with the Spirit” (v18).As Christians, our lives ought to be in conformity with God’s will.

For Reflection: Do I believe the Eucharist is intended “for the life of the world”? Do I seek to dwell in the house of Wisdom ?

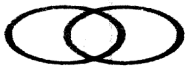
