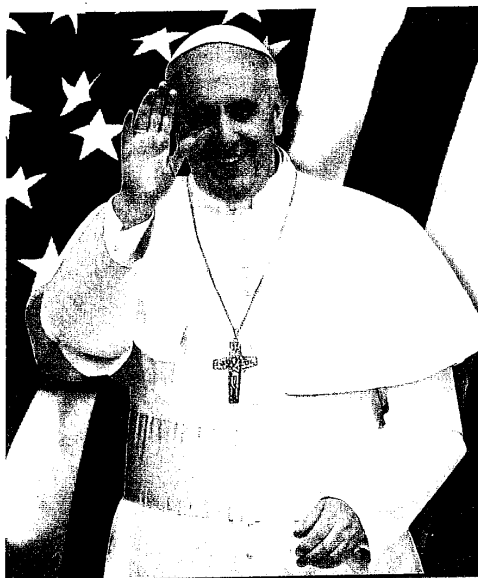

## 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Nm 11:25-29 Ps 19:8, 10, 12-13,14 Jas 5:1-6 Mk 9:38-43,45,47-48

The Book of Numbers narrates Israel's time in the wilderness. In today's reading the LORD bestows "some of the spirit that was on Moses" on "the seventy elders"(v25). The Lord does this in response to Moses's complaint. "I cannot carry all this people by myself" (see v14). Two of the 70 elders on the list "had been left in camp" rather than going out to "the tent" (that is the ,tabernacle) -but even they received the spirit and "prophesied in the camp" (v26). The Lord continues to provide for the good of the people, despite their grumbling.

James sounds a word of warning to the rich: "weep and wail over your impending miseries" (v1). Their crime is that they hoard their wealth rather than providing for the poor. But like the rich fool in Jesus's parable, they will learn that earthly riches do not last. Gold and silver corrode, and moths eat even the finest clothing . As we welcome Pope Francis to the United States this weekend , we are called to renew our concern for those who go without because of the greed of others. The cries of the poor "have reached the ears of the Lord of hosts"(v4).

The exorcist "driving out demons in [Jesus's] name" (v38) serves a reminder (echoing our first reading )that we cannot limit the spirit of God. "Whoever is not against us is for us" (v40), Jesus tells his disciples. He goes on to say that eternal life is worth what ever sacrifice We have to make; of like the buried treasure or the pearl of great price that he speaks of Elsewhere, even if we have a sacrifice a "hand" (v43) or a "foot" (v45)or an "eye"(v47), the kingdom of God is worth the price.

For Reflection: Can I see the spirit of God at work in those who are the "seventy elders" of today's church ? Do I make an effort to address the plight of the poor?

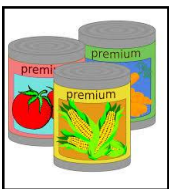

### What is the difference between feast days and solemnities?

Feasts and solemnities differ in terms of their importance. Solemnities are the highest rank in the Church. Christmas, Easter, All Souls Day , the Ascension, Corpus Christi, and the other celebrations of events in the life of Jesus are solemnities than feast days. These days are like Sundays but they aren't always Holy Days of Obligation. We say both the Gloria and the Creed on such days. " Thus recalling the mysteries of the ( the Church) opens up to the faithful the riches of her Lord's powers and merits so that these are in some way made present in every age" (CCC#1163). Far from being "solemn ," solemnities are joyful occasions to celebrate.

Feast days honor important saints or events from the lives of Jesus and Mary. The Catholic Church celebrates these feasts because they are snapshots in the history of the Church and of God's saving love for us. They call to mind sacred mysteries or events Recorded in the history of our redemption.

### Feast September 30th

St Jerome (436). St Jerome's great love of the Scriptures led Pope Damasus to ask him to translate the Bible from Hebrew and Greek into Latin. Called the "Vulgate," it became the official text of the Catholic Church and made the Bible accessible to many more

Hope House Ministries has celebrated it's 35th Anniversary on April 25,2015. On this date, I announced that we will be moving to the Little Portion Friary on Old Post Rd. in Mt. Sinai. Thirty –five years ago, I was blessed to rent the guesthouse at this facility, so we have come full cycle with our ministry.

Out of respect and gratitude, we will maintain the 'Brothers Bakery', the Prayer Ladyrinth and leaves the chapel open for members of the local community to come and pray. We will call the new community Hope House Ministries-Hope Academy at Little Portion Friary. We hope to make the transition in the fall.

All our programs continues to be filled to capacity. Each entity continues to touch people in miraculous ways that oftentimes are beyond words. These daily miracles happen because of the extraordinary support that we receive from you.

Pax Christi continues to minister to growing homeless men, which is shocking because they are young, between the ages of 16 and 25, living on the street. And there is a tremendous rise in the number of returning veterans in need of a wide range of human services, especially mental health service
